

I cannot believe that I am writing an article for August already. I feel like just yesterday I was putting all the Christmas decorations in the garage. Time is moving on and we all feel it (if you are over 30 you really feel it, before 30 - I thought time crept by at a snail's pace). We need to maximize each day we are given. We need to do the same thing as a church.

In a very recent Vision Committee meeting there were some probing questions asked about our current status here at Pritchard. They caused each of us to begin to evaluate our church's ability to grow and continue to be viable in the years ahead. We began to analyze whether the consulting process we undertook two years ago was paying the dividends we had intended. It also motivated each of us to evaluate our own responsibility for the progress or for the failure. Have we become complacent, settling for the mediocre instead of the excellent? This exercise, although sometimes painful, is necessary if we are to give our very best effort to the Lord.

The staff, along with the Vision Committee and those involved in the Consulting process, are going to look again at the things we said we needed to do in order to be successful in providing the atmosphere for growth. If we have dropped the ball in some of those areas, we are going to make sure we revisit them and correct that oversight. We want to strive for excellence in every area....we know we are missing the target in some areas.

No matter what we find, I can tell you right now what is going to make the biggest difference going forward. It is each of us saying, *"This is not about me, this is about finding God's will and making the sacrifices personally needed to join Him in accomplishing what He wants to do here at Pritchard."* Please hear me when I say that it will take sacrifice on our part to make it work. We can't use phrases like, *"I don't like that"*, or *"that's not my preference"*, or *"I wish we would do it like we used to."* Many a dying church has uttered those words and failed to exist. It is about being willing to think differently in order to improve our reach to children, youth, young adults and those who don't currently have a relationship with Jesus. I know that is what you want, as much as I do.

Because we love every age group in this church, we are going to consider all of you in every decision. But we are all concerned about the number of children and youth we are reaching. We must be willing to change to reach more. This is going to happen. Worship is not what it used to be, but if it was, many of the people we have now attracted would not be here. I promise that every now and then, we will follow a service of all choruses with all hymns. David Bailes does an incredible job of trying to meet a wide range of musical tastes and desires. It is impossible to please us all every week. But singing is not about pleasing us, it is about pleasing God. Our singing praises Him and he inhabits the praise of His people.

I have a great deal of improvements that I can make to help us do a better job of reaching more for His kingdom here at Pritchard. I want to be open to God's leadership and to your suggestions for improvement. It's not about me. It's about pleasing Him. I hope you will join me in making that your goal in the months ahead!

By now, all final payments for the week should be made. You should have also received a detailed letter from me, explaining everything you need to know to make your week the best it can be.




