By the time you receive this I hope two things will have happened: You will have received a book called "21 Days of Breakthrough Prayer" and you will have heard my January 29th sermon on the importance of prayer for Pritchard's future. At the end of January, I had to quickly change my schedule and lead a women's retreat in the mountains of Virginia. "Wise Ignorance: The Art of Living Well" was the focus and as session one began, the women leaned in ready to listen. I smiled as I spoke, and to be honest, I was overwhelmed at times.

Here sat women in front of me (the youngest in the room) and they wanted to hear what I had to say. But as I was speaking, I was reminded that they were actually leaning in to hear what God would say to them through me. Book of choice? Proverbs: Wisdom Literature of the Bible. The Hebrew sages would say this book is not a very spiritual book of the Bible and would encourage one to read it in small nuggets (of wisdom). Savor the instructions. Ponder. Hold onto the wisdom learned tightly.

Most of my notes came from Dr. Ellen Davis' book, "Getting Involved with God: Rediscovering the Old Testament." Dr Davis is an Old Testament professor at Duke Divinity School, and she has a wealth of knowledge on the Old Testament. I even had one friend sit in her class on Ecclesiastes and sob during the class because of her profound knowledge and eloquence of speaking about God's Word. What does Dr. Davis say to do today in relation to our own ignorance and our own knowledge vs. godly wisdom?

To find someone further along than you, a mother or a father in faith. And when you find someone whose guidance you can accept for at least this stage of your journey towards God – then lean forward, listen acutely, obey. (pq. 102)

I am seeking godly wisdom. I want to live a life where that is my number one desire. So, to help me on my journey, I look for those that are further along than me.

In the Fall, when we start the Saturday night service, we will have sons and daughters LOOKING for a mother and father in faith. They will be new to the faith. They will need godly wisdom and guidance. They will be hungry and ready to "lean in and acutely listen" to your experiences and what you have learned from God. So I request you not only join me in praying for these precious souls who will be coming to our campus, but also begin jotting down the godly (continued in next column...)

wisdom you continue to learn. Hold on tightly to the wisdom you have gained, no matter your age, and prepare. We will have ALL AGES ready to learn. YOU will be a blessing to even one! I KNOW IT and I cannot wait to see who all comes seeking and ready to meet Jesus!


