

Blessed Assurance

"Jesus knew what it was like to be alone – even in a crowd."

There are few realities as traumatic as feeling completely alone. It can be horrifying – feeling that you cannot reach out and no one can reach in – isolated, trapped, like you are in a box with the lid closed over your head. How well Daniel knew those very feelings. He faced a devastating reality.

The Biblical hero, Daniel, was more than 80 years old when he was placed in the lions' den. He had been faithful to God. People knew him as a person of character. He was a good guy, and yet as an older person, perhaps even frail, he was cast alone into a most perilous situation. All those around him felt his fate was sealed. Fear could easily have gripped Daniel. Anxiety could easily have washed over him. The danger he faced was real.

There are many perilous situations that we face in this life. The world we have built, the life we have cultivated over many years, can change drastically. The loss of a loved one, a close friend, the diagnosis of an illness, or financial woes can make us feel that our world is crashing down around us.

But scripture tells us that God is with us. The morning after Daniel was thrown into the lions' den, his captors were amazed to find him untouched by the lions. Daniel professed, "My God hath sent his angel, and hath shut the lions' mouths." (Daniel 6:22). Daniel had not been alone, and God was glorified by all who witnessed his saga.

The writer of Hebrews reminded the early Jews who followed Jesus that God was there (31:6). This was the assurance they needed as they were isolated and viewed with skepticism for their new faith. The person Jesus, who they now followed, was a Jewish heretic. Family members and friends turned their backs and closed doors that previously had been open. In many ways, they were alone.

Jesus understood what His followers would face. He knew what it was like to be alone – even in a crowd. He understood facing fears. Jesus said, "These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation, but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world" (John 16:33). He is the lifeline to all those who call upon Him. He is our hope. In His final words spoken on this earth, He offered assurance that He would be with His believers always, "even to the very end of the world" (Matthew 28:20).

None of us desire to feel the pangs of loneliness. But it is at these times that the promises of the Living Word can comfort us. Just as it was with Daniel, even as it was with the first New Testament believers, the Spirit of the almighty God is with us to deliver us. We can stand, even alone, victoriously in this assurance!

We all know that 2020 was indeed a different year for each of us. We did manage to have one pick-up for Blanket America Ministries in August. We were so pleased to have 15 volunteers that day to help us pack the trailer that was dropped off at 7:30 AM for us to load at our pace. You donated over 323 large boxes/bags and containers filled with your generous donations for the people in the Appalachian Area. In addition to clothes, handbags, shoes, linens, toiletries, kitchen and household items, jewelry, books, CD's, DVD's, games, puzzles, toys, electronics, tools, crafts, holidays items - all of these items boxed; you donated over 21 pieces of furniture, lamps, large rugs, pictures and other non-boxed items. These items are all greatly appreciated by the people in the Appalachian Region that Blanket America Ministries serves. God's love is shown to these people each time you choose to donate to this ministry. Our WMU Mission Shoppe had to close in March due to the virus, but your purchases still helped us raise \$1,588.90 for the Baptist Men Local Project Fund (Helping Hands) for supplies and tools needed for the work they do. We still do not have a date when the Thrift Store will re-open. When the time is right, we will open. Services Streamed LIVE Online!



PHASE 1: In-Person Sunday School WILL CONTINUE in 2021 until further notice

The staff has met to discuss how Sunday school has gone in Fall 2020, and it is agreed that Phase I is the safest and best option for our Sunday School time together. As a reminder, Phase I guidelines are as follows:

- 1. It is up to each individual (teacher and class attendee) of when they would like to return to in-person class. This, of course, is not mandatory for anyone to return and if a teacher would like to continue to teach via phone or online, please feel free to do so! EVERYONE'S SAFETY IS KEY!!
- 2. Teachers that are ok returning to teach can rotate with teachers in their assigned areas.
- 3. If someone does not have a class, or they would like to visit another class, they can attend the classes in the Fellowship Hall or Overflow Center.
- 4. We ask everyone to wear masks when indoors and practice social distancing.
 - All assigned areas will have chairs set-up 6 feet apart
 - There will be NO FOOD OR BEVERAGES offered during this time due to COVID-19 restrictions
 - Teachers if your class members are ok with you removing your mask when teaching, please feel free to do so for this abbreviated time
- 5. All areas, including bathrooms and elevators, will be cleaned thoroughly each week in prep for the next week.
- 6. In children and youth classes, temperatures will be taken upon entry and mask will be worn by all children K-12th grade.
