





Education continues to be affected as kids returned to school under some of the same restrictions they faced months ago.

We also struggle with the different voices that are reporting to us the facts surrounding the virus. We have become increasingly skeptical as we hear so many different opinions on what the truth really is. We have become so use to everyone having an agenda that supports their personal views or the views of a political party, that we don't know what to believe anymore. Hart Square's 37th Annual Festival


