

#### **North Carolinas Baptist Aging Ministry 2021 Highlights**

NCBAM Strong! "Blessed are they that dwell in thy house"...they **go from strength to strength (Psalm 84:4-7).** "For aging adults who are lonely, in frail health, and need help for the journey from the North Carolina Baptist Aging

Ministry, the march goes on."

NCBAM received two major awards in 2021...the George L. Maddox Award was presented to NCBAM in September to recognize the ministry's "excellence in creative programming for older adults." The Maddox is the most competitive award given by NC's Division of Aging and Adult Services (DAAS).

NCBAM also received the First Place Award for their audio book "One Hope: 30 Daily Devotions for Overcoming Loneliness" by the Baptist Communicators Association. NCBAM distributed more than 400 copies of the devotional in 2021 to seniors experiencing loneliness. An outstanding team of men and women wrote the devotions. I had the privilege of narrating the 20 male written devotions for the audio book and Charity Johnson, also of NCBAM, narrated the 10 female devotions from the Podcast Recording Studio at the NC Baptist Children's Home in Thomasville, NC.

NCBAM was selected to receive funds from the Tractor Ride that kicked off the 2021 Southeast Old Thresher's Reunion at Denton Farm Park. NCBAM supporters broke all fundraising records for the event! Through sponsorships, admissions, and the live auction, NCBAM received \$29,947.00! Funds will be used for ministry projects this year.

NCBAM's Senior Adult Ministry State Leadership Conference last May was a response to thousands of calls from seniors seeking help with vaccine appointments. Live stream from Pritchard Memorial Baptist Church, "Bridging the Gap" addressed the digital divide that challenges and isolates many older adults.

NCBAM's AAIM Fall Regional Gatherings featured two keynote addresses videotaped here at Pritchard on "Grief and Loneliness in a Time of Crisis."

The Call Center is the heart of NCBAM - everyday connecting seniors with community services and mission-minded volunteers. In 2021, we had 5,815 calls in and 944 calls out. Servant Care contacts were 875. FEMA Alarms installed: 192. Hope Line Volunteers trained: 50. Information and referrals provided: 1,971.

For the past six years it has been my privilege to serve as chairman of NCBAM AAIM. As I begin my seventh year, I look forward to getting back out in person with our outstanding leadership team from across the state of NC. We hold our first Statewide NCBAM AAIM ROUNDUP at Bay Leaf Baptist Church in Raleigh, NC on May 2, then I'll be leading sessions at SummerFest at Fort Caswell May 16-20.

NCBAM AAIM (North Carolina Baptist Aging Ministry Aging Adults Innovating Ministry) offers "Help for the Journey" for all senior adults throughout all 100 counties of North Carolina. NCBAM is a jewel for the NC Baptist State Convention.

A familiar passage from Ecclesiates tells us there is a "time for everything". Scripture tells us there is a time to plant and a time to uproot, a time to tear down and a time to build, a time to mourn and a time to dance. All this is true, but what happens when we don't take the time necessary to do these things? What happens when we work on our own time, instead of trusting God's timing? The truth is we usually make a mess of things and end up with bigger issues than we started with. History has shown us humans to be a slightly hard headed bunch, though. The gift of free will often looks like a curse. Just ask Eve about that apple from the Forbidden Tree!

While this first paragraph may appear to focus on the decisions we make, what I truly wanted to focus on is time. There are many precious things on earth. Diamonds, fossil fuels, gold, but the most valuable asset I can think of is time. Science has yet, to my knowledge, found a way to create more "time". The 2-3 minutes you'll spend reading this article is an investment. It shows you believe there is some reward in "spending" your time reading this message because maybe you'll find some knowledge or comfort in it. Time is the most precious possession we have, because the time we have here on Earth is limited. The amazing fact is, what we do with this limited time here on Earth, determines what happens in our eternity. We must choose to invest our time wisely.

In working with those in recovery, there is often a great sense of guilt, remorse and self-pity in the years wasted in active addiction. Sometimes it is those same feelings that push us back to old behaviors and lifestyles. We feel as if we've been living a certain way our entire lives and cannot break the cycle or change. That simply is not true and is from the enemy talking. Take for instance Saul who was converted on the road to Damascus. Saul was an evil man, murdering and hunting Christians down, but God used him to write a majority of the New Testament. Saul, who became Paul, found value in dedicating his life to Christ. He found more freedom in a jail cell than many of us find in life today. He wrote, "For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain". Paul understood the value of his time here on Earth in doing God's work and the result of him investing in his future in eternity. Now I don't expect any of us could imagine the peace Paul found to pen such words, but today we can examine where we fall short. We can look at where our time is spent and whether we are taking the "time" to do as God would have us.

As I write these messages each month, I am often reflecting on my own life. I believe a good steward of the Gospel is often speaking to themselves, for we can never be self-righteous or prideful. God despises arrogance and "gives grace to humble". What I suggest is being intentional with our time. Just as we budget our finances, we must budget our time. Most will receive a paycheck bi-weekly, but our deductions from the "time account" are limited. We must be mindful where we invest, making sure the return is fruitful. Take time this month to balance the books and be frugal with our most valuable possession. Scripture states there is a time to be born and a time to die. Fill the time in between with His works and find joy in your life.
