We've all heard the saying "April showers bring May flowers". That's great as we head into the month of May, but what about every other time of the year? How can we walk through the valleys of life being expectant of the view from the mountain top? The answer is faith.

With Easter just passing, I read a lot of blurbs from the perspective of the Disciples this year. Many were from "Silent Saturday", you know, that Saturday after Jesus died on the Cross between His resurrection on Sunday. I couldn't imagine the faith they demonstrated in this lowest of valleys. Having literally followed Jesus in His ministry to see Him die on the Cross and waiting for the Truth to be revealed on Sunday. I would imagine it is the same kind of faith Moses had as he commanded the Red Sea to part, or the faith Daniel had that he would be safe in the lion's den. Throughout scripture, God has shown us these demonstrations of faith and how faith without works is dead. Faith is the building block of a relationship with Christ and it is necessary to navigate through the valleys of life. So how do we grow and strengthen our faith?

In my experience, my faith has grown when I stop trying to understand the "rain". I've learned that God's vision is transcendent of time, meaning He can see the future and the past, therefore having the ability to put together the events in the middle. When I put my faith in things happening the way they are supposed to, rather than the way I want them to, my faith in God's timing begins to grow. I've come to accept that God loves me. He gives me evidence of this fact on a daily basis. As my Heavenly Father, He has demonstrated time and time again how He has my best interest at heart. As I continue to see facts of His omnipotence, I grow to trust Him and therefore grow my faith. Trust is a vital ingredient to faith. If I did not trust God, I would not believe in His will over mine which usually means I would end up making a mess of things. I know this from experience as well.

Another "virtue" I've found of importance as we grow our faith is patience. This principle is often put on a pedestal because it is rare and delicate. In a society based on instant gratification, it is difficult to express how powerful patience is. Between Google, Facebook, Amazon and Netflix we don't have to wait for much. Maybe that's why traffic is so stressful for all of us these days because it is one thing in our lives where instant gratification isn't readily available, unless you count the Expressway on I-77. If prayer is our most powerful tool as a *(continued in next column....)* Christian, I believe patience would come in a close 2nd. When we pray to God, we usually expect a prompt answer as if it's an email of some sorts. The reality is our prayers will always be answered in some form or another if we are patient. Scripture shows us many stories of patience, from Job to Abraham. God did not answer prayers on their time, but rather on His and for His glory. For Job and Abraham, it did not hinder their faith, but in retrospect it enhanced it.

The next time you're feeling stressed, stuck in traffic or just downright irritated, remember God has a plan and it's better than yours. Remember valleys are worth walking through and there's something to be learned from every trial. Perspective is one thing we can control. If you can't change your situation, change the way you're looking at it. Take a step back and see what God is designing, for in our weakness, He is strong. We must depend on Him during the rain and know the sun is coming soon.
