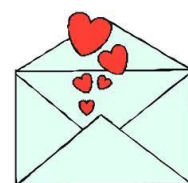

Life is short...

I've been reminded of the fragility of life given the funerals I've already performed this year. Four lives ended too soon, all for friends under the age of 40. These types of facts, as dismal and dissuading as they sound, push me to one central fact. There is still much work to be done. Scripture declares EVERYONE will hear or know of the Gospel of the Kingdom (Matthew 24:14). I know it is the great commission for me to do my part and encourage others to do theirs.

Each week at Overflow Addiction Ministry, I am grateful for the site of a full altar. I am grateful not because people have problems, but because they know where to leave their problems. I grew up in a church where the altar was either full or empty. I was a kid, but I knew when someone went down to pray, they had some big problems. What I didn't realize is that those who bring big problems to the altar, also have a "Big God" and an even bigger faith. The act of prayer is our most valuable tool in communicating with God. Not that God needs our communication, but because He wants it. As the altar fills each week, I thank God for the site. I thank God I get to see lives changed and I thank Him for His provision and grace.

This month (7/9/22) I shared a message on the value of time. To my knowledge, it is one thing we cannot create more of. It is the currency of life, yet many of us waste this precious gift of time in the depths of addiction, self-pity and despair. Many of us waste time being selfish, prideful, arrogant or boastful. Then there are those who spend their time in the trap of comparison, always looking at others happiness instead of seeking our own. Having fit into all of these categories at some point, I must share the joy of being a "laborer" (Matthew 9:37). We can find real joy through work and investing the time we have here into the lives of others. Afterall, that is what we are called to do.

As I spent time away last month at the beach, I struggled to detach with so much work still to be done. My mind constantly races and probably the most when I'm trying to slow it down. I thought ahead to Ridgecrest, an upcoming speaking event in South Carolina and our International Overdose Awareness Day event to be held here on campus (8/31). I know there is always going to be something else to be done, actually I'm grateful for this fact. As I stared at the ocean, I wondered if the waves ever felt as if their work would never be done. I was sitting on the beach with my family and my mother-in-law informed Lily the waves "never stopped." Lily curiously asked, "Even at night!?" My mother-in-law chuckled and said, "Even at night. Even though you cannot see the waves, you can still hear them." How much wisdom in these words and fact adults can take for granted. So much like the waves, we must always remain at work and vigilant for Him. Sometimes that work can be exhausting and time consuming. Sometimes it can simply be kindness and a smile. Most importantly, our prayers may not be seen, but I know they are heard. Even in the darkest times of life.

Life is short, but it is also beautiful.
