A Month of Prayer and Fasting

I am asking you, my family at Pritchard, to join me in a month long prayer and fasting emphasis. 2nd Chronicles 7:14 says, "If my people who are called by my name will humble themselves and <u>pray</u> and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land." Our land needs healing. I believe if we join our hearts and minds in prayer, God will hear our prayers and work in our individual lives, the life of our church, and in our world.

The focus of fasting is not the absence of nourishment, but substituting spiritual food for the physical food. It does not matter whether you fast for one meal, or one day, or for several days. The benefit will come from taking the time usually spent preparing and eating a meal and using that time to pray or study God's Word. We will provide a prayer guide for you that we hope will simply serve as an outline for your praying. God will expand your list the more time you spend with Him. Please take this emphasis seriously. Not only will you personally benefit from this time, our church will benefit greatly. Believe God is going to do miraculous things as we follow His direction to humble ourselves, pray, seek His face and turn from your wicked ways. Below is our suggested prayer list:

- Pray for your personal spiritual condition. If there is any sin your life, confess it and ask God's forgiveness. Ask God to reveal to you His plan for you in spreading His love with our world. Thank Him for your personal blessings.
- Pray for our church. Pray that God will use us to reach others with His saving knowledge. Pray that He will give us a clear vision of His will for us. Pray that He will start a fire in each of us that will be the beginning of the revival we seek. Pray for all of our staff as they attempt to lead our ministries ministerial and support staff.
- Pray for the needs of your fellow church members. Pray for the sick, the grieving, the anxious and the depressed among us. We can help lift burdens by showing God's compassionate, loving spirit to others through our prayers.
- Pray for our addiction ministry. Pray for Josh and Jennifer Bone, Kelsey and Lily. Pray for the Saturday night worship experience, the Anchor homes and all those who are finding community through this Pritchard ministry. Pray that <u>you</u> will be a source of love and healing for any who come.

- Pray for our Bible teaching for all ages. Knowing and loving God's Word begins at an early age and stays with us through life. Pray that more and more will discover the value of studying His Word to us. Pray for Stan Heiser as he leads the Christian Education and Senior Adult ministry.

What is independence and why was it something worth fighting for so many years ago? Independent is defined as being "free from outside control". We are all aware of the gift/ curse of free will from the beginning of time in the Garden of Eden. Still as a society, independence is something most of us strive for throughout life until we attain it. Why is that? Why do we work so hard to exhibit independence, only to find it's not nearly as fulfilling as our minds perceive it to be?

The answer is we were not meant to do life alone. God made Adam a partner, therefore making connection and community an essential part of life. Although love is not considered a primary need such as food and shelter, it does fall into secondary needs and is essential for psychological health. I've personally found it impossible to maintain physical sobriety without a focus on psychological and spiritual health. After all, I initially drank because I thought it helped my mental state. I couldn't have been more wrong.

What is helpful in improving my psychological state is dropping the idea and value of independence and replacing it with an eternal dependence on God. Paul says, "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain". This often quoted scripture illustrates not only the importance of dependence on God, but also the joy of a life rooted in Christ. Although some may find Paul's sentiments to be extreme, to know the full story of his conversion into this perspective are truly examples of God's miraculous works.

As July is a time where we celebrate our independence as a nation, take time to invest your dependence into our Father. Take time to examine where you can be more spontaneous in prayer. Prayer should not become ritualistic, for the need for prayer with God isn't for communicating, but for connection. He knows our needs. He wants our commitment. I've found when I put in the footwork, God always fulfills His plan.
