This will be my final article to share with you through the Messenger. As you heard in worship on Sunday, October 23, my last day of work here at Pritchard will be on November 23. I have accepted an Interim Pastor role at a church in Gaffney and will begin my work there on December 1. It is an opportunity I feel God is telling me I cannot say no to. It is with great sadness, but also with a sense of anticipation, that I say goodbye to my family of faith here at Pritchard. We've all known for 10 months that this day was coming, and it is the right time to make this transition.

It is hard for me to believe that I have served here at Pritchard for 17+ years. 2005 just doesn't seem that long ago. From my first day here you have treated me and my family with such love and support. I have loved every minute of being your Pastor. I have said many times there is no better place in the country to Pastor and I mean that sincerely. You have done more for April and me personally than we could have ever dreamed. # **Pritchard Pastor Search Team Update**

Pritchard friends,

As you know by now, on January 9, 2022, Pastor Bobby announced his intention to retire at a point still to be determined in the future. His stated goal was to stay until a new pastor was called or until God opened clear vision into his next step in ministry. Given Bobby and April's move to Gaffney, SC a couple of years back, it should have come as no surprise that a local church would be poised to grab someone of Bobby's quality and reputation. So, while it was difficult to hear it spoken aloud this past Sunday, his announcement of actually *taking* that next step should be a time of celebration for the Morrow family *and* for Pritchard, as well as for a place in need of his giftedness in loving and healing a hurting church.

In preparation for this eventuality, the Pritchard pastor search team ("PST") was nominated and voted unanimously into service by our congregation on February 13. Those members are as follow: Vickey Arroba, Meagan Crowell, Perry Holland, Frances Nettles, Jeff Rogers, Chris Wallace, and Marilyn Withrow. In unified fashion, we took several months to identify the core needs of Pritchard that would advance the cause for Christ in South End, as well as create an opportunity for us to move together boldly into a future of greater relevance in our community. After presentation to the congregation, SS classes, parents of youth and children, and the August "Messenger", we then published the posting in late July.

Since March 3, the PST has met together over 30 times, exchanged countless emails, texts, and 100+ pages of notes exhaustively taken by Meagan Crowell. In the two months after the posting, the PST reviewed at least 60 resumes, CV's, and/or email contacts received (pmbcpastorsearch@gmail.com), with 10-15 of those receiving varying degrees of consideration for an interview. Three of those 15-20 ended up meriting multiple interviews, winnowed down to two, and eventually gleaned to one candidate.

At this juncture in mid-September, the PST took a pause to discuss whether to move forward with more advanced contact with the candidate. After discussion and prayer, we decided to engage additional external resources, garnering another batch of 10-12 qualified candidates; we did not take this step out of any great hesitancy about the current candidate, but rather to expand the pool one more time to see if God brought anyone forward that was comparable to or exceeded the current candidate. **He did not.** 

Obviously, the PST would have loved for final decisions to have been reached prior to Bobby's announcement on Sunday, however as of today - October 26 - key steps remain in that process. It is entirely possible that this union proceeds and opens a new, exciting era for Pritchard! However, it is also possible that our search process continues into the holidays and into 2023. As we pray for God's wisdom and guidance to that end, the Personnel Committee and the PST are committed to working diligently on behalf of our church to bring forth the outcome most pleasing to Him. Regardless of the conclusion, please lift your prayers for our candidate and his family during this time.

Thank you for your continued prayers and support for our efforts.
