#### The Patient Work of God

As many of you may have already picked up on, patience is not exactly my strongest virtue. When I was small, I would sprint through the cavernous halls of my childhood church, nearly causing catastrophe after catastrophe for the older adults that were trying to share the space. Like a racecar, I would dart in and out of traffic in those halls, knowing that wherever I was going, I needed to get there QUICK!

I've taken on all kinds of disciplines and prayers since: "God give me patience" I ask as I sit at the red light, or as I help the kids with math homework. Discipline has helped, slow work to get better results: exercise, Greek or Hebrew, writing, or studying. But at the root, I am still a 21st century person, caught in a culture of impatience and already short on the quality to begin with.

So when it comes to my calling and vocation, there is a certain irony in seeking to embrace the ways and the work of Jesus: the kingdom is like a garden, the kingdom is like a mustard seed, the kingdom is like a field of wheat interspersed with weeds. You can't rush it, and you can't cause it to do anything. God does the growing because God is the source.

I am excited to invite you to join us over the coming weeks and months leading to Easter. We're going to be embarking on a longer series, "The Agriculture of Jesus" starting at the beginning of February. We'll be considering and looking at the ways Jesus taught about kingdom growth and kingdom mindset. I want to invite you to come to our Ash Wednesday event. Details are in progress, but it will be a come and go type of thing. You'll probably want to allocate about 30 minutes or so for it and we'll have extended hours to hopefully accommodate schedules. And then I want to invite you to consider taking on a new discipline between Ash Wednesday and Easter, maybe a commitment to a richer prayer life, or to studying one of the Gospels in greater depth, or to \*gulp\* fasting. We'll have some printed packets to help walk you through it, but for now please be prayerfully considering: God where are you seeking to plant seeds and grow those seeds in my spiritual life? I'm so honored and delighted to be part of this church, and look forward to growing with you and with our Lord, together.

#### **NC Baptist Aging Ministry 2022 Ministry Highlights**



NCBAM strong! "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ." "For aging adults who are lonely, in frail heath, and need help for the journey from the North Carolina Baptist Aging Ministry, the march goes on."

NCBAM received two major gifts in 2022. We were blessed to be the recipient of an annual tractor ride fundraiser that kicks off the Southeast Old Threshers' Reunion each summer at

Denton Farm Park. NCBAM received \$29, 947 for Rampin' Up 2022! These funds were matched by 49 churches to purchase lumber for 62 wheelchair ramps built across the state. Ramps built in 2022 were up 34% over our last (pre-pandemic) Rampin' Up 2018.

The second gift NCBAM received was a grant from FEMA to improve the safety of countless older adults through the \$40,000 Fire Prevention and Safety Grant. We're so grateful for the trust FEMA has placed in NCBAM and in church volunteers by awarding us a second grant for \$78,000 to use in 2023-2024.

For the past seven years, it has been my privilege to serve as chairman of NCBAM AAIM. As I begin my eighth year, I look forward to getting back out live with our outstanding leadership team members from across the state of NC at our Aging Well Conferences March 16 (Cary), March 23 (Lewisville), and March 31 (Asheville). We hold our statewide NCBAM AAIM ROUNDUP at Griffith Baptist Church in Winston Salem May 2, then leading sessions at SummerFest at Fort Caswell in May and August.

NCBAM AAIM - North Carolina Baptist Aging Ministry and Aging Adults Innovating Ministry offers "help for the journey" for all senior adults throughout all 100 counties of NC with the help of partnering churches, like Pritchard and volunteers from across all 100 counties. NCBAM is a jewel for the NC Baptist State Convention.
