

David Foster Wallace started a speech one time with this: "Two young goldfish were swimming before school one day, when an older goldfish swam up. The older goldfish said 'Morning boys, how's the water?' and swam off. The younger goldfish looked at one another and said 'what in the world is water?'" Wallace would go on in this speech to talk about all the water we have in our lives. The things that surround us and fill our lives that we never look at or think about.

We each have unconscious habits, routines, places we go or ways we think. We have work flows, we have rest flows, we have writing habits and speaking habits and watching habits. These and so much more make up the "water" of our lives.

We're in the midst of this lengthy series leading to Easter: The Agriculture of Jesus. You know and I know that nothing can live without water. But how often do we step back and evaluate the various waters that make up our lives? Do we have an unconscious habit of complaining and criticizing first? Do we tend to disengage when things challenge us? Have we written people off if they don't do what we want? Or do we entertain fear or anger more often than we should? Those things are all the types of water that can adversely effect our spiritual lives.

But what if we each took time this Lent season to look at the water that surrounds us and consider which elements of it are helping us grow spiritually? What if we made an intentional decision to purify the waters of our lives, to focus on "whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable, if anything is praiseworthy..." as Paul encourages? I tend to think we would see the amazing fruit and the amazing harvest that Jesus promised. I pray that we can all consider and evaluate the waters of our lives this month. Thank you for blessing me as we work together for the kingdom!

#### **Amazing Grace Anniversary**

January 1 of this year marked the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the first time that "Amazing Grace" was sung in public. Written by Anglican minister and former slave ship captain, John Newton, "Amazing Grace" was written for the New Years Day service at Newton's church in Olney, Buckinghamshire, England. It is said that Newton led his congregation down the road from his parish church in Olney to Lord Dartmouth's Great Hall to sing "new" music not traditionally allowed by the Anglican Church. The original title of Amazing Grace was "Faith's Review and Expectation" and Newton wrote it as a personal expression of his own journey. We don't know what tune "Amazing Grace" was originally sung to, but it was not published with the tune it is most known for, New Britain, until 1835.

Amazingly, this one-time slave ship captain became a tremendous influence which led to the ending of the slave trade in England.

Of course, "Amazing Grace" went on to become what is likely the most beloved and most often sung Christian hymn!




Don't forget! Set your clocks ahead one hour before going to bed Saturday night on March 11<sup>th</sup>!
