As May rolls into June, I am shocked that I'm already coming into my fifth month of service here! Wow, time flies when you're literally trying to learn everyone's name and a whole new set of roads and who is related to whom! As I've gotten to know this wonderful church family and seen how we do things, I have been amazed by the servant's hearts. The deep desire of our church to love and reach those who surround our church building and the entire world with the love of Jesus.

As I've had these conversations, here are the big picture goals that the staff and I are suggesting we embrace for the coming church year (which we're considering September through August, in order to embrace the rhythms most of our people already live by). We're going to build and discuss these initiatives throughout the summer, then seek to fully work on them in the fall.

First, we want to be deliberate and intentional about how we "Open the Front Doors." What are the front doors? Not necessarily those that open in the back of the sanctuary, but they can be. More, the "front doors" of today include our internet presence, hospitality team on Sundays, and our homes where we hope to have groups and fellowships.

Second, we want to seek to "Grow Small." This does not mean losing members or having fewer in attendance on Sunday mornings. Instead, it means we are hoping to emphasize that growth in the 2020s often occurs in more niche settings, such as home groups, small group events, and over the dinner table. Large events do not fuel church growth the way they used to, but everyone we know wants meaningful relationships. Church is a wonderful place for that.

Third, we are asking everyone to "Invest Intentionally." One of the difficulties in the church world is that some of us think we can do everything. We can't. But each of us can do SOMETHING. And this is the big one we are looking to get in front of you this coming summer. We're going to be looking at the help our various ministries need, including our hospitality team (think Sunday greeting), kids' ministry, youth ministry, and so many others. Please do NOT think about signing up for every ministry. Please DO think about what God has made you passionate about and commit to pitching in there. We will be working our way up to a church "Signing Day" (it's actually two days) at the end of August, the 20<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>. We're going to try to get everyone to sign up to pitch in somewhere, then we'll be starting those things on September 3<sup>rd</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>.

All this to say, look for more details, ask God to work on your heart and the hearts of others. If we want our church to be light and joy in the years and decades to come, it is going to take all of us working together to love outsiders in the name of Jesus.






#### "Invest Intentionally"
