About three years ago I applied for a Doctor of Ministry program at Portland Seminary at George Fox University. I was accepted, and now on May 4<sup>th</sup> I'll be graduating. It's been an eventful three years. Many of you are familiar, but if you are not familiar with the DMin, it is a little different than a PhD. A PhD is a research type degree, usually requires some French or German, and largely is useful for professors. The DMin is more comparable to a medical doctor, it is a practitioner's degree.

My particular DMin area of study is about semiotics, the study of signs. Signs can be literal signs, like stop signs, but they can also be words, styles of dress, symbols. Signs can also be the way we consider and present doctrine or our own denominational positions.

The month of May, we're going to be doing some intentional talks about the distinctive theologies that make Baptists. We could consider these the top-level values that help us define and understand our other commitments. They can be found on our website and are listed here: the authority of scripture, the autonomy of the local church, the priesthood of all believers, and the separation of church and state. These were hard-fought, born from great suffering, persecution, diligent theological consideration, and collaborative work.

So many of the pressing issues of our day can be better understood and grappled with if we will embrace these Baptist distinctives. Many of the struggles and anxieties we often feel can be alleviated if we would trust the simplicity and wisdom of these tenets. I want to encourage you, this month and beyond, to consider the many ramifications that these signs have for us, the challenge of these doctrines, and the wisdom of our ancestors in faith in arriving at these tentpoles of what it means to be Baptist.
