"Bid all our sad divisions cease and be yourself our King of Peace."

One small line in the gospel of Matthew that often gets skipped over: "*All the generations from Abraham to David are fourteen generations; and from David to the deportation to Babylon, fourteen generations; and from the deportation to Babylon to the Messiah, fourteen generations*" (Matthew 1.17). In other words, two 7 generations, plus two 7 generations... in other words, six 7 generations from Abraham to the Messiah. In other words, Jesus himself was the seventh 7.

Matthew is the most Jewish of the gospel accounts, and we'll be camping out in Matthew from now until Easter. And in the Jewish mindset, seven was the number of completion, wholeness. So, 7 generations were a complete generation. But seven 7 generations? Wholeness compounded with wholeness. And in the Jewish mindset, wholeness was often conveyed through Shalom, which we often translate peace.

And peace certainly is some of it. But we are meant to be whole, at peace. Whole and at peace with God. Whole and at peace with our world. Whole and at peace with our families, our children, our churches. The gospel message is the beginning of finding our Shalom, finding our whole peace in this world.

That line from "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" has been echoing through my head: "bid all our sad divisions cease, and be yourself our King of Peace." What would we give for that? Do we hunger and thirst for that kind of Shalom in our lives?

The Christmas season is such a beautiful time, lights, décor, family, parties. I would encourage you during this season, place your peace and your wholeness in the hands that were born into that manger. Place your Shalom into the only hands worthy, find your peace and your Shalom in his this season. Adore him, worship him, and watch the rest of your life make more and more sense, and give more and more peace.
