One way we can redeem that time is by taking the month of January to re-align ourselves. Let's spend some time asking ourselves if we were the people God wanted us to be in 2023, were we the church God wanted us to be?

I think if we're all really honest, it's always a bit of both.

This January, 2024, I want to encourage you to think about two aspects of your spiritual life and personal life: community and purpose.
