

Some of our New Year's resolutions are going strong, hope you are all flossing! Some of our New Year's resolutions fell apart at Five Guys. Some of our New Year's resolutions never made it beyond the planning phase. Wherever you are regarding resolutions, I have some great news. Lent is coming!

Lent is kind of a funny thing for many of us. Growing up Baptist it was always foreign to me. I had Catholic friends that would suddenly stop having chocolate or would be eating a Filet O Fish on Fridays. Gross. But as I went to college and then seminary, then as I started into church ministry, I started to see the incredible gift Lent could be.

Lent is, of course, not really in scripture. But it is based on the stories we find, specifically Jesus' 40 days in the wilderness. Lent is used as a time to prepare our hearts and minds for Easter. I want to encourage each of you to participate to some degree this year.

Our Lent season will begin with Ash Wednesday, which takes place on February 14 this year, which is not great timing honestly. Ash Wednesday we will have, here at the church building, a prayer labyrinth set up in our Fellowship Hall/Gathering Place for you to come participate in. This will be open from 12 Noon until 7:30 PM that evening. It will be a come and go type thing, so you can drop in at any time that it's open. I would estimate it will take 30 minutes or so for you to participate. Many of us came last year, but if you didn't a prayer labyrinth can be a variety of things, specifically this one will have various places to focus your prayers, to reflect, and to enrich and deepen your spiritual life.

At the end of the labyrinth, I will have several new disciplines I'll encourage you to consider. Lent is often a time when we give something up, but I also think Lent can be a time we take up a new discipline, something that will build and form our spirit in new ways. This year I will have several suggested disciplines: study of the book of Matthew, prayer, fasting, generosity, and new to us this year, fasting from politics. Each discipline will have its own printed packet, which will guide you through 40 days of the discipline.

I would encourage you now to begin reflecting and praying on what God might have you take up this Lent season. Begin reflecting on why we take 40 days to anticipate Easter. And begin reflection on the joy that we anticipate, the grave is empty, and our savior lives!

#### **Music Ministry**

A few weeks ago, we celebrated in worship with a Classic Hymn Sunday. We will celebrate in February with a Gospel Hymn Sunday. Musical style in worship continues to be a subject that many are passionate about. I imagine there are those in our congregation who are delighted about the "Hymn"



Sundays, while others, not as much. Some would like to have more, or all hymns, more often, while others, not as much.

To have preferences in musical style in worship is really quite normal, just as we have preferences in ice cream flavors, colors and a myriad of other things in life. That's part of the way God created us. When it comes to musical styles in worship, though, I would contend that while style is important, what is most important is the lyrical content of the songs. Hymns may contain rich theological truths and/or words of praise to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and to God, the Father, and Holy Spirit. But modern worship songs can and do contain very similar lyrical content to hymns. God is continuing to gift composers and lyricists as they create new songs for worship. May I remind you that "Amazing Grace! How Sweet the Sound" was once a new song.

Therefore, I would ask you to consider two things as we gather and sing for worship -

- 1. What is the lyrical content of the song regardless of the style? What is it saying?
- 2. While a given song may not be in my preferred musical style, what about the person across the aisle from me? Are we willing to sacrifice our preference for theirs?

We are going to have more "Hymn" services occasionally, but we are also going to sing newer songs. While we may not sing with shared preferences, may we sing the truth with one heart, one voice and one purpose!
