"All that you touch, you change. All that you change, changes you." Octavia Butler

Butler wrote a few books about this concept, and funny enough some of her thoughts spurred a type of religion from them. Don't worry, I'm not trying to convert you to that, I'm firmly convinced of the truth of Jesus. But, that doesn't mean we can't learn from other religions, groups, philosophies, writings, etc. And this quote from Butler has stayed with me.

Change is always a topic at the front of our minds, we recognize the reality, the importance, and the inevitability of change while also often resisting it. We WANT change. Or at least we recognize we need it. Change calls us to weigh our values, to consider the future, and to allow ourselves to journey into the unknown.

I believe Pritchard values following Jesus. I believe Pritchard values welcoming all the prodigal sons and daughters home. I believe Pritchard values the transformational power and joy of the gospel that Jesus the Christ was crucified, buried, and rose on the third day. These are our top-level values.

When it comes to change those values aren't changing for us. Gut-check time, though. We have to ask ourselves, if our preferences, our habits, our traditions, our creature comforts, if those things prevent us from enacting those top-level values, will we give those things up or toss our values instead? If each of us could be a little bit uncomfortable, but we knew, KNEW that someone might meet Jesus that wouldn't meet Jesus otherwise, would we be uncomfortable? What are our values worth to us?

I realize change is difficult, but I would encourage everyone to also see: change is inevitable. The medical patient that will not change his diet to avoid heart disease is simply embracing the change that comes through a heart attack. The taco company that will not embrace change by embracing Uber Eats is simply embracing the change of decreased profits. And the churches that do not embrace change... well I think we have seen plenty of examples. My invitation to you is to find the joy on forsaking all else for the sake and the call of the gospel. It's an adventure, it's a winding road, it is change. And it's wonderful.



#### Staffing Update:

This month I am pleased to give some exciting news: Grace Sykes is going to remain with us on staff in a part-time pastoral role for the next year.

When a foundation approached me to ask if there was a way to support our women's ministry or what major areas of need we had as a community, I quickly responded that we had a wonderful young pastor who was recently ordained, and that I wished we had the ability to keep her on staff longer. The foundation then responded by promising a year's part-time salary so that we could retain Grace in a pastoral role.

She and I are working on a title, but the summary of her role this coming year will be: women's ministry, continuing to assist with new members' class, augmenting our spiritual formation processes, and (this one ends up being a lot) helping me in a huge variety of ways. I am thrilled with the development, believe that she has already had a major positive impact here, and am very grateful that this does not require us to utilize money from our budget, but does allow us to continue to forward the mission of Pritchard.
