All On The Table

It doesn't take much to see that we live in a divided and divisive time. It's hard to have a conversation about current events without someone getting a bit... aggressive. Israel and Palestine. Russia and Ukraine. IVF treatments. Women as pastors. The 2nd amendment. LGBTQ discussion.

Likely for many of us, one or more of those words or phrases got you at least a LITTLE bit tense. This conversation could get out of hand. What we see modeled for us and what each of us has likely even participated in, is that if we enter those conversations then someone will have to win and someone will have to lose. Likely, the relationship itself will have some scars at best and fracture at worst.

But, here is the question, can Christians disagree on those topics, can Christians disagree on topics I didn't list, and still remain a family of faith?

Often we'll say, yes, but what we expect then is we simply don't discuss anything that we might possibly disagree about. We ignore disagreements and pretend they don't exist. Or we minimalize the freedom of others to have their own views. Is there a better way?

I think so.

In January I assembled a team, not the Avengers but close. The team is helping me create a space and a time for us to discuss difficult issues. The format will be fairly simple: discussion, communion, meal. The name of the event is "All on the Table" and we will be meeting monthly on Sunday evenings. This is not a decision making event, we are not trying to change bylaws or our church's position on things. This is not a forced uniformity event, we are not seeking to make everyone agree before we leave each month. This is a Unity in Christ Alone event, a reminder that the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ is our hope, and that after that we have the safety and freedom to discuss things, to struggle together, to reason together, even to **gasp** DISAGREE together, and to come back together for the purpose of the gospel.

This is your first formal invitation to join us. The second Sunday of each month, from August through May at 5 PM we will gather in the Fellowship Hall for All On The Table. And we are asking you to place all your struggles on the table, all your doubts, all your disagreements, all of your politics, theology, opinion, argument... all of it on the table. And to leave it, pick up communion, and find unity in a divided and divisive world. Not the cheap unity of complete uniformity, or the easy unity of ignoring difference, but the costly and wonderful unity found in the body and the blood of Jesus Christ.

Look for more information. In the month of August, it will be for our church only. After that, we will be inviting outsiders. On August 11, we'll be discussing "church matters" like who should be allowed to be members, who should be allowed to be ordained, and what is worship supposed to be? I hope you can join us in this wonderful adventure, August 11 at 5 PM!

A Particular Flying Biscuit's Special Sauce - PART 2

Last month I told you that over the next several months, I will share with you why Amy and I decided to make the drive to a particular *Flying Biscuit* restaurant by relating our experience there (their *special sauce*) to Pritchard Church being *"the neighborhood church."*

The special sauce is **community**. Community is what we will "put on" all that we do. Without it, Pritchard Church can't be "the neighborhood church."

Here are just three of the "ingredients" of community. (I'll give more next month.)

1. A heap of "welcome." From the time Amy and I pulled in until we left, we felt welcomed. The folks at Flying Biscuit went out of their way to make eye contact with us, greet us, smile at us, and thank us for dining with them. The staff made us feel like their day was made better by us being there.

When "welcome" is in the sauce, you are glad you showed up. It seems so simple, but it is so very important.

- 2. A pound of "care." Since we have Oakley (our dog) with us, extra care is required to ensure that we have a good experience. We need to sit outside. We need to be seated in a place where we can keep Oakley out of the walkway. When "care" is in the sauce, you feel loved. It has been said that people don't care how much you know until they know how much you care. It takes a little effort, but showing care speaks volumes.
- 3. A handful of "interest." The staff at *Flying Biscuit* is interested in what is going on with Amy and me. They ask questions about our house. They want to know how our adjustment to Charlotte is going. They want to make sure Oakley is comfortable. When "interest" is in the sauce, you feel valued. It takes initiative, but being interested in others reaches a level that few, outside of close friends and family, reach.

Church, I'm confident that if we will welcome, care for, and show genuine interest in others, they will be glad they came, feel loved, and know we value them. If that happens, we will be well on our way to developing community that people will be drawn to.


