From our earliest origins, people are storytellers. When we talk about the traffic on the way into the office, when we describe the guy who assembled our burrito, when we share adventures from our childhood: we do all these things through story. The reason we do that is because our brains seek narratives, they seek to understand the world and build models to make sense of the world. Story is the most accessible way to do that.

Each story shares components: stories need setting, they need characters, and they need action. Action is change and any good story is about change.

BUT human nature is to resist change, to seek comfort and to seek stability.

So we find ourselves between what we want and what we need: we want comfort, but we need change and growth. We want to be lazy, but we want to be in shape. We want to sit on the couch all day, but we want to have purpose in the world. Story is about change and change necessarily has conflict and friction.


Through this life, we pull back when we see conflict. We start to believe "conflict is bad, stability is good." But the reality is instead: conflict is nearly always our opportunity to grow. Conflict is our chance to change, to be more than we would have been otherwise...

For many of us, our invitation to change is wrapped in the conflict of the gospel story itself: the son of God came to the far country to save sinners (you and me). And the conflict is there within us: will we embrace that salvation or will we hold tight to our old life. Will we embrace change or will we insist on comfort? Will we move forward with courage, clear eyes, and galvanized hearts, willing to journey into the unknown, walking behind the one who was crucified in order to be born a whole new creation? If we would, then we will find ourselves in conflict, but the conflict leads to our joy.

This month and next we're going to be looking at the conflict between the old world and the new: the seven signs of new creation in the book of John. And we'll see how the values and teachings and miracles of Jesus come into conflict with the old world and with our old selves and call to us: come be made new. I hope you will find life and joy in this series!
