As we've been kind of sprinting through the book of Acts, one thing strikes me now like it has several times before in reading this book: the Church just solves problems.

Sometimes we get caught up in the "right" way to solve a particular problem today, and then we think any other way is the "wrong" way to solve that same problem. We find ourselves in arguments and debates and sometimes hostility over which "right" solution is exactly THE "right" solution.

But for the early Church, they don't seem to be as bothered as we are by the simple dichotomy of the "right" or the "wrong" way to solve problems. They ultimately seemed to trust that Jesus would sustain them through all the storms, and then they moved forward. And I'm sure, even though we don't have any official word that they had "committees" as such, we do see they had some designated roles and some particular offices like "deacons" and perhaps "overseers" and "apostles." I highly doubt they had the kinds of job descriptions that we often develop for those roles, but I think we can be certain: there were differences of opinion on the ways to move forward.

We find ourselves in that same space these days as well.

One of the most important pieces of problem solving is at the beginning: correctly naming and identifying the problem itself. In staff meetings we often discuss exactly this. And one thing we try to emphasize is that *people* are not the problem. They may highlight the problem, they may exacerbate it, they may even actively participate in it, but the people themselves are not the problem. People are the church, so the whole thing exists so they can serve the mission of God together. But, sometimes we really get bogged down because we can't mutually identify the problem itself.

Once we've identified the problem, then we can begin to work the problem. And this what the disciples did, over and over again. They recognized the needs of the mission or of the church itself, and they worked on it until it was largely solved.

I think one modern temptation is to blame, to make others the problem, to pull ourselves from any level of error and basically say "well, if so and so would such and such, this would all be solved." Seldom is any problem so simple. Especially in something as complex as a church with hundreds of people and hundreds of expectations and hundreds of experiences that lead to hundreds of misunderstandings. What we can do, though, is choose to treat one another as we'd like to be treated. We can identify issues, and we can decide that we will work together to solve them. This is what we see throughout the book of Acts, and this is what Jesus invites us to today as we continue his work in this world.

If you recall the July report, you will see that the August month-end report looks better. We knew that there were contributing factors to July ending with a large deficit. Other months like July and items such as the parking lot income were not what we expected. Unfortunately, we are still behind for the year.

While that is a "downer," an encouragement to me is found in that one of the six income line items, tithes and offerings, is \$33,904 ahead of last year at this time. Unlike line items like parking lot income, the tithes and offerings line is a reflection of generosity in the hearts of the people of Pritchard. My prayer is that God will honor this generous spirit and will provide in ways that bless us and Himself.

In my last article, I shared that giving is an essential part of our walk with Jesus. When we give, we are expressing that we have put God first in our lives and we are giving thanks to Him. God gives us time, energy, and resources (money). What we do with these gifts ultimately defines the character of our life and the depth of our spiritual understanding. I shared that transformation is the result of us letting God have increasing amounts of control over what we do with all the things He gives.

I am convinced that one of Satan's lies is this: if you can't give "X" amount, God isn't going to be happy with you, so you might as well not give anything. That, my friend, is a lie from the pits of hell. God doesn't need your money. God, however, does want you to be transformed into the person He wants you to be, and He uses the sacrificial giving of money to do that. Why money? He uses money because He knows how important money is to us, and He knows that if we will "put our money where our mouth is" and worship Him by trusting him in the area of finances, He will use the giving of that "offering" as part of the transformative work He wants to accomplish.

You have likely heard our pastor talk about the fact that God wants to do transformational work in all of us. Part of His work involves the area of finances. (I'm sorry, but we see it repeatedly in scripture. There's just no way around it.) Would you trust him with \$5, \$25, \$100?

If you want to read a really cool story about transformation, read Luke 19:1-10, juxtaposing it with Luke 18:18-23. One man gained more than he could fathom by being generous with what is temporary. The other man settled for the temporary to forfeit eternal riches.
