The Prodigal Savior

Through our study of Luke, the main theme is "the Prodigal Savior." What we come to see as we examine the narrative of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus is that in order to rescue the prodigals, the son of God became prodigal.

He became prodigal to our expectations of a savior. The temptation account demonstrates the ways we typically believe God works - through material blessings (turning rocks into bread), through political power (using the powers of this world in order to force obedience), and through celebrity (using exceptional entertainers to jump off high places and demonstrate their prowess).

He became prodigal to his own people, defying their understanding of holiness and goodness. Rather than exacting revenge and retribution on the Romans, he forgave them. Rather than extracting an eye for every eye previously taken, he restored sight to the blind. In that process, Jesus experienced rejection by those that he was closest to.

He became prodigal to the religious expectations of his day. The Pharisees and teachers of the law believed that morality was found by following a strict set of rules. "Do this, don't do that, can't you read the signs!" The people he came to save trusted their law, trusted their rules, and thought that God did too. But Jesus demonstrated a morality that was beyond the law: love your enemies, bless those that curse you, do to others what you'd like done to you.

We are talking about a prodigal savior, and the great news is that prodigal savior makes it where we don't have to be prodigal any longer.

But, what we saw in the parable we continue to see in life: those who cannot accept and welcome home those other sinners, those who refuse to live under the rules of the prodigal savior, make themselves

prodigal to him. The older son put himself out of the house because he could not tolerate grace for others. He needed to make sure justice, his own justice, was served. And so the story ends in invitation.

The invitation is for all of us. If we know we're lost, great, easy to come on home. But if we believe we are righteous the invitation becomes all the more important: stop worrying about those sinners and their sins, just be glad they're home. Come enjoy the party with the all the prodigals, including the prodigal savior.

Wrapping Up 2025

The Thrift Store currently exist to support the mission work of "Helping Hands" (formerly called "Baptist Men's Local Project Fund"). Our "Helping Hands" ministry builds ramps for the elderly and handicapped at no cost to that individual. An item donated is never wasted. For 14 years, items that we could not sell in the Thrift Store were boxed up and given to Blanket America Ministries which served the very poor of the Appalachian Mountains. Proceeds from our Thrift Store from 2003 through 2013 (including yard sales) was \$156,506.51. Proceeds from 2014 through 2025 (no yard sales included) were \$72,823.87. The total for the past 23 years has been \$229,320.38. Our proceeds for 2025 were \$7,549.38. We thank all who have donated to this mission project, who have stopped in to shop, who have spread the word, who have volunteered and who have prayed for us. We know God is working in our ministry by the blessings that are received from the work of those using the funds.

The Thrift Store is open on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month from 10:00am-4:00pm. We are closed in the months of August and December.

To God be the glory for all that He does for us and others because of this ministry!
